"Publicity is justly commended as diseases," claims Attorney Brandeis. Publicity attending these disclosures, according to Brandeis, has meant that "the battlefield has been surveyed and charted: the hostile forces have been located and appraised." But there must be a further call upon publicity for service, pleads Brandeis. "That potent force," he says, "must, in the impending struggle, be utilized in many ways as a continuous measure." Pointing out that "combination and control of other people's money and business, and the wealth of the investment banker are the main factors in the development of the money investors-"a toll that is literally 'all that the traffic will bear ". bankers' e ompensation should, of course, vary according the risk he assumes. Where there is a large risk that the bonds or stock will not be promptly sold at the issue price, the underwriting commission (that is, the insurance premium) should be correspondingly large. But the banker ought not to be paid more for getting investors to assume a larger risk. Now the law should not undertake (except incidentally in connection with railroads and public service corporations) to fix banker's profits. And it should not seek to prevent investors from making bad bargains. But it is now recognized in the simplest merchandising that there should be full disclosures. Require a full disclosure to the investor of the amount of commissions and profits paid, and not only will investors be put on their guard, but bankers' compensation will tend to adjust itself automatically to what is fair and reasonable."
