## MEDFORD MAIL TRIBUNE ROGUE RIVER IN SHAPE SAYS MAYOR

E. R. Rosser, mayor of Rogue River, has filed his blennial report liquor licenses, \$109 from poot, dog and show licenses, \$90 from fines, \$58 from pound fees. The expenses totaled \$6220, divided as follows: Interest on bonds, \$727; police, recorders and city Hall, \$1381. Permanent Improvements, grading, sewer, city hall, etc., \$3597; warrants redeemed, \$513, In addition the mayor remarks:
