1914 CALENDAR OF SPRAY DOPE HAS FEW CHANGES

A comparison of the 1914 spraying calendar with those of previous years will show some very important changes in its makeup.

One important point brought out in the calendar is not in the part devoted to the use of lime-sulphur in the spring.

The iron-sulphide spray has been omitted and in its place the atomic sulphur is advised.

In a few instances apple tingis caused considerable foliage injury, and it has, therefore, found a place on the calendar with its remedial spray.

Potato growers are requested to pay particular attention to the matter of preventing Rhizoctonia infection on potatoes.

It must be understood that the calendar does not contain all the information that may be needed at times.
