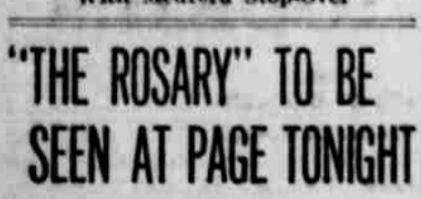

SWATTING THE CIGARETTE

THE State Federation of Women and the state superintendent of public schools have launched a campaign against cigarette smoking by minors.

Section 2148 of Lord's Oregon Code provides: It shall be unlawful to sell, barter, trade, give or in any manner furnish to any minor under the age of eighteen years, any tobacco, cigars or cigarette in any form, or any compound in which tobacco forms a component part.

Section 2149 makes it unlawful for a minor to smoke or use tobacco in any form on public streets, or in public places, and provides a \$10 penalty for conviction.

Section 2150 provides heavy penalties for persons contributing to the delinquency of a minor—which would render those who sold or supplied minors with tobacco subject to conviction and liable to \$1000 fine or a year's imprisonment.

There are sufficient laws covering the subject. All that is lacking is law enforcement. Smoking of cigarettes is common among the boys of the state—very common among the youth of Medford.

Cigarette-smoking youths rarely make good in the battle of life. Their energies are sapped and will-power undermined. They are devitalized mentally and physically and prevented from attaining normal development.

County Judge Tou Velle states that all the delinquent youths brought before the juvenile court are cigarette smokers and that all those sent to reformatories are confirmed cigarette fiends.

Superintendent Churchill's resene plan is to be statewide. In one way or another he will have control of sixty-eight prizes at the next state fair and he gives notice that not a solitary prize shall go to a cigarette smoker.

Youth should be informed in school and home of the evils of cigarette smoking. Appeals to pride and boyhood should help youth shun the destructive evil.

BUD ANDERSON DENIES QUARREL WITH DICK DONALD

PORTLAND, Or., Jan. 29.—The statement of Dick Donald, his manager, at Los Angeles today that they were about to sever business relations from Vancouver, Wash., Bud said that a telegram sent by Donald telling him that he had been matched for a twenty-round bout with Red Watson February 20 at San Francisco, was delayed in reaching him, but that he had answered today accepting terms.
