

PROSECUTION FOR COMMISSION MEN WITHOUT LICENSE

There being no firm in Medford complying with the commission merchants' act, passed at the last session of the legislature, Prosecutor E. E. Kelly has been instructed by the state railroad commission to make an investigation, and present evidence collected to the spring term of the grand jury for action.

The bill regulates the commission business, and requires a license for the operating of their business of \$5 per year, besides a surety bond to protect farmers, orchardists, and gardeners, who consign produce from fraud in the sale and disposition thereof. The bill was introduced by Representative John H. Carlin, and was prompted by the finish of the Rogue River Commission company, about a year ago, in which many local growers lost heavily.

Failure to comply with the bill is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100, and revocation of state license.

WOMAN CONVICTED OF WIDNEY EXTORTION

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Jan. 29.—Mrs. Mary Vaughn, a San Francisco clubwoman, was found guilty here today of attempting to extort \$500 from Judge R. M. Widney of Los Angeles. The evidence showed that Mrs. Vaughn promised to have a white slave charge against Arthur B. Widney, Judge Widney's son, dismissed upon the payment of \$500. Mrs. Vaughn took the verdict calmly. She was ordered into the custody of the sheriff and will be sentenced Friday. The jury reached its verdict after deliberating less than ten minutes.

GRAND JURY TO PROBE VIOLATIONS BLUE SKY LAW

The grand jury which convenes in February will be called upon to investigate several alleged violations of the blue sky law passed by the last legislature.

According to the district attorney, many thousand dollars have been taken out of Jackson county since the enactment of that law for the development of outside projects, principally oil wells and mining schemes. The promoters of these schemes have in most instances failed to comply with the requirements of the new law
