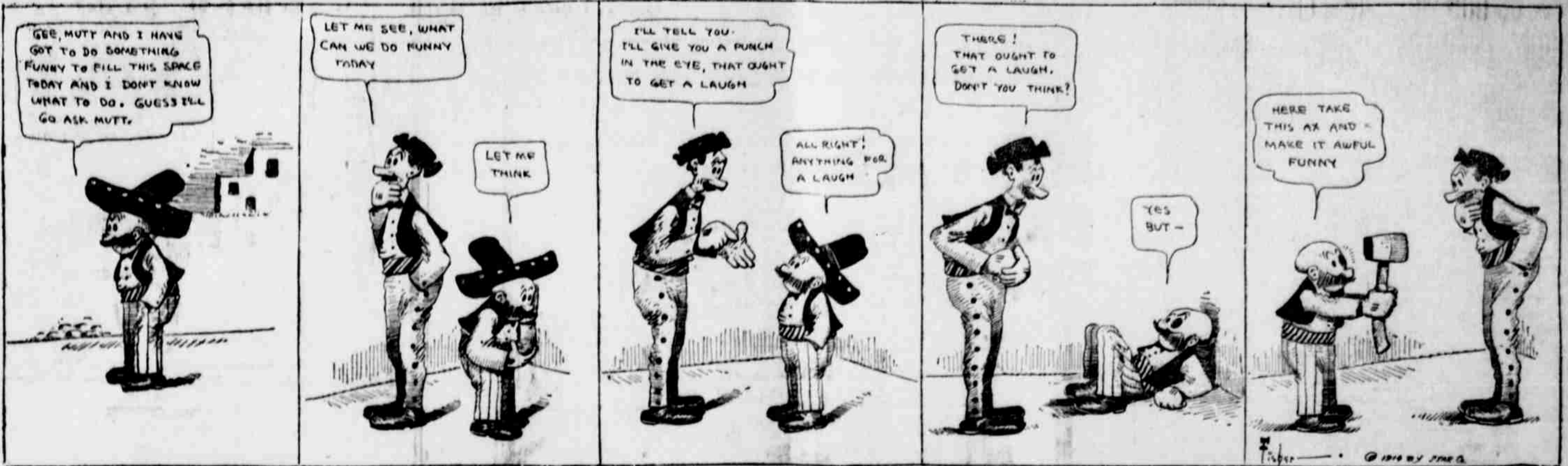


Pursuing the Lonesome Laugh Is a Sad Life
