JUAREZ, Mexico, Feb. 4.—Gen. eral Villa lost no time in taking ad-vantage of the opportunity to pro-perly arm his men. He arranged for the immediate delivery of 1,060,000 rounds of ammunition and ordered more in carload lots. At the same time he sent his legal adviser, Aguirre JUAREZ, Mexico, Feb. 4 .- Gen-Benavides to El Paso to thank President Wilson, through General Hugh Scott, for what he had done and to druff is gone and hair has stopped falling. ask the release of 1,500,000 rounds of ammunition, 5000 rifles and several rapid-fire guns recently seized by United States troops.




