

## RATES TO CRATER UNITES MEDFORD KLAMATH FALLS

No one in Medford was more pleased over the new rates and schedule granted by the Southern Pacific company than Court Hall. In an interview Mr. Hall says:

"The way the auto stages were run last summer, was in the nature of an experiment, but proved highly satisfactory to the public and also to ourselves. Heretofore Klamath Falls has had the advantage on account of the Southern Pacific company, not granting rates via Medford to Crater Lake from California points.

"We just had to do something last summer to attract tourists by way of Medford to Crater Lake. So we put the round trip fare down from \$25.00 to \$15.00 and spent \$200.00 in advertising. The amount of business we did opened the eyes of the Southern Pacific company official who were quick to see that with larger inducements and territorial rates, the traffic to Crater Lake would increase correspondingly.

"Medford and Klamath Falls are now on an equal footing as to rates, and tickets honored both ways. Such arrangements will keep all jealousies down and help both cities. The Commercial clubs of the two towns should get together and form some advertising plan to bring the people to Crater Lake during the coming season.

"The Hall Taxi company received some nice compliments last season both from the public and railroad for its courteous treatment and service.

"John M. Scott has made good his promise to me last summer. Too much credit cannot be given to Mr. Parkhurst who has been a tireless worker in getting reduced rates to Medford. I think the new \$18.00 round trip rate from Medford to Crater Lake fair to the public and the Crater Lake company, as ten cents per mile is considered very reasonable to ride in an auto stage over mountain roads.

"There are several petitions being circulated opposing the government granting the Crater Lake company concessions to operate an auto stage line between Medford and Crater Lake. This is done from selfish motives, when one stops to consider the amount of money the Crater Lake company has invested, the number of years they have run their auto stages at a loss, it is an unjust thing to do. Now that the business was increased last season every one wants a slice. Independent operators of autos would only go to Crater Lake when financial inducements justified, while the railroad and government require the Crater Lake company to run on schedule time, passenger or no passenger, money or no money."

In this connection, it may be stated that those who are circulating petitions are wasting their time, as the Crater Lake company already has the concession and it is the policy of the department not to interfere with concessions granted.

## ROCKHILL MAY BE AMBASSADOR TO CZAR'S COURT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—Henry M. Pindell of Peoria and Charles R. Crane of Chicago both having refused the United States ambassadorship to Russia, the former because so much controversy preceded his confirmation and the latter on account of the pressure of his own business, it was said today that President Wilson was considering William Rockhill, a republican and ex-minister to China, for the post.

It was agreed that a diplomat of much skill will be needed for some time to come at St. Petersburg, as business interests are bringing pressure to secure the opening of negotiations for a new Russian-American trade treaty, through which they hope to gain as much as possible commercially, while leading Jews want an arrangement made to safeguard their rights in the Czar's dominions and entitle them to travel there like other Americans. Confidential reports from Russia have indicated that the St. Petersburg government is unwilling to make this concession.

Rockhill has served the government abroad with much credit and advisers of the president. It was said, however, that he believed the appointment would be a good one.

## 961 NEW YORKERS DISAPPEAR IN YEAR

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—Statistics published here today showed that 961 New Yorkers disappeared in the last three months. Of this number, 297 were women and girls. Only 194 of those who disappeared were found.

The police were combing New York today for Florence Lawlor, aged 16 years, who disappeared from her home Monday. It was believed white slavers are holding her a captive.

## FRENZIED FINANCE CHARGED AGAINST CASHIER COMPANY

PORTLAND, Or., Feb. 5.—Frenzied finance in the promotion and management of the United States Cashier company of Oregon is charged in a complaint on file in the circuit court here today in behalf of James S. Birrell, owner of ten shares of stock in the company.

The appointment of a receiver and a permanent injunction to restrain officers of the company from dismantling its factory at Kenton, a Portland suburb, is asked for in the complaint, and an accounting of its property is demanded.

All of the directors of the corporation are named specifically as defendants, but the action is specifically directed against Frank Meneffe, its president, and Thomas Riley, inventor of the patent rights on which the promotion of the company and the sale of its stock was based.

The company was organized in 1909 for the purpose of manufacturing coin paying, coin changing, list-in and adding machines, with a capital stock of \$200,000. In 1910 the capitalization was increased to \$1,250,000.

The complaint alleges that although practically the entire capital stock was issued and sold, the company is so nearly insolvent that its sole assets consist of the plant at Kenton, worth probably \$50,000, on which there are now two mortgages aggregating \$30,000.

## GRAFTING SCANDAL IN JAPANESE NAVY

TOKIO, Feb. 5.—The minority parties in parliament decided today to impeach the administration on account of the discovery of alleged grafting in the navy. They have not the numbers to cause any removals, but a terrific scandal was expected.

## ASSOCIATED PRESS TO BE PROSECUTED UNDER TRUST LAW

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—Prosecution of the Associated Press under the terms of the Sherman anti-trust law was demanded today in a complaint filed with Attorney-General McReynolds by William Reick, publisher of the New York Sun. Assistant Attorney General Todd was assigned to investigate Reick's complaint.

Reick's action is aimed at the morning branch of the Associated Press, against which there is no strong competition. It was not believed any serious attempt would be made to charge monopolistic features in connection with its afternoon service, as the United Press serves more evening papers than the Associated Press.
