German Coffee Cake

Made Without Yeast

There is no warm bread quite as appropriate for Sunday morning breakfast as German Coffee Cake, yet it is seldom made by housewives who do not bake their own bread. FIRST NAVAL FIGHT OF MEXICAN WAR NOW IN PROSPECT

NEW ORLEANS, La., Feb. 6.—That Mexican federalists and rebels will soon have their first naval battle off the mouth of the Mississippi river was predicted here today.

The rebels have nearly closed arrangements for the purchase of a small steamer, four three-pounders, several machine guns and a quantity of rifles and ammunition. Loading, these onto the boat, the plan is to run outside the three mile limit, mount the guns and proceed to shell the federal port of Matamoros.

The federal government knew of this plan, it was understood, and messages from Vera Cruz said the gunboat Zaragoza had just left there to fight the rebel war-craft.
