### CHANCE TO SECURE MILITARY ACADEMY NEAR MEDFORD

Medford has a chance to secure a military academy, and Colonel Walter R. Kohr, president of the Missouri Military Academy of Mexico, Mo., will be here April 1 to look over the field. He writes as follows to the Commercial club:

"I have your kind letter setting forth the advantages of your town. I also have your beautiful booklets. Medford appeals to me and I shall certainly investigate it further. Your data with others of similar character which I have received from the northwest makes me feel more than ever certain that a great future awaits the man who can make good. Consequently I am now decided to come to your section about April 1 to personally look over the field, and fully expect to stay. In the meantime, however, in order that I may expedite matters as much as possible, may I ask the following questions:

"Would Medford be interested in the matter to the extent of giving a bonus in the shape of buildings and grounds—not money—to the right man? I would of course expect to put in some of my own funds as a guarantee of good faith.

"Do you think it possible that the railroads would advertise the school as part of the advantages of the town? Would they give transportation for canvassing purposes (getting new students) in payment for advertising in school publications? I might say that each cadet will average seven one-way trips yearly between his home and the school.

"Could the necessary building operations be completed in time for opening of school in September?

"Will you kindly send me at least two copies of your daily papers?

"What are your present railroad connections? This applies particularly between Portland, Seattle and Tacoma. Kindly send local time tables.

"There is no question but that the high-grade private school is destined to become one of the features of our educational system. The military school is particularly valuable to a town because of its advertising value and the fact that the money it gets is all outside money. If you will look into the advertising sections of one of the great magazines, e. g., Cosmopolitan or Everybody's, you will be more than ever impressed with the magnitude of the private school idea as a business. It will also show you the tremendous competition under which I have been compelled to labor in this section. In spite of this, we have never failed to show an increase over the year before and have always made a substantial net gain. **The Right Way to Roll a Cigarette**

- I. In fingers of left hand, hold cigarette paper curved, so as to receive the tobacco. Four right quantity of "Bull" Durham out of mullin sack with right hand, strewing tobacco evenly in paper.
- II. Then place your two thumbs next to each other in the middle of the paper in this position.
- III. And roll the cigarette on the lower fingers, so that the index fingers move up and the thumbs move down. With the thumbs, gently but firmly force the edge of the paper over the tobacco, and
- IV. Shape the cigarette by rolling it with the thumbs, as you draw them apart.
- V. Hold the cigarette in your right hand, and
- VI. Moisten the projecting edge of the paper.
- VII. With fingers close ends of cigarette by twisting the paper, and you have a cigarette properly made, properly shaped and ready to smoke.

VII. This is NOT the way to make a cigarette. The thumbs—not the index fingers should be used.

### THREE DEATHS FROM COLD IN MINNESOTA

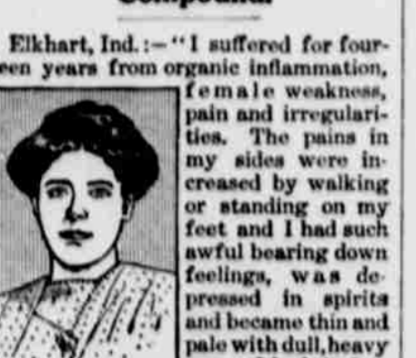
MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Feb. 12.—Three deaths, directly due to the intensely cold weather, were reported here today.
