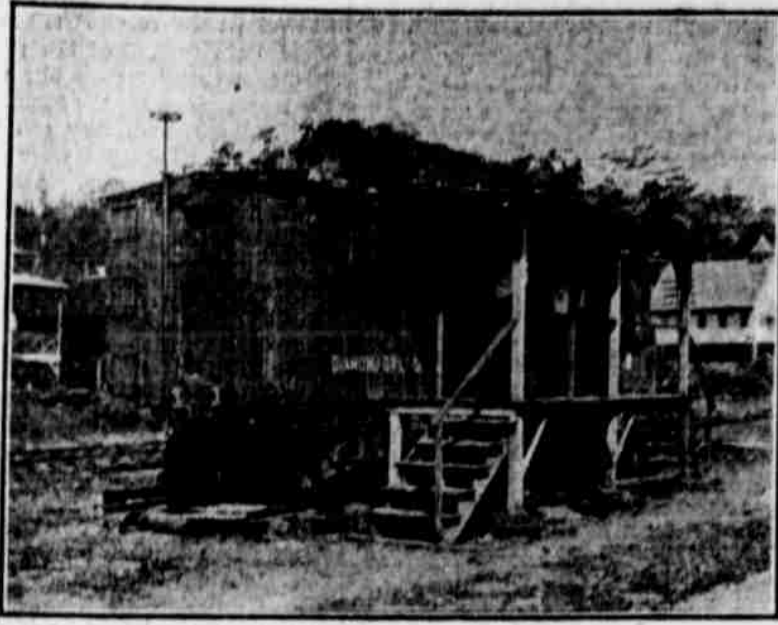
"QUO VADIS," RELIGIOUS PLAY, FILM AT STAR
