

A WAY STATION ON THE PANAMA CANAL.



Along the line of the Panama canal the local railroad stations are in a very simple style of architecture. Everything is sacrificed to utility. A great deal of time and labor is saved by converting the familiar box freight car into simple and serviceable stations. A ticket window is cut on one side, a slot for a letter drop and the station is complete. Once the site of a local station is decided upon, a siding is quickly laid, and the "station" is run down on the next train and switched into position. A rough platform, roofed with corrugated iron, and a set of steps completes the station. The accompanying photograph, which was snapped by a tourist on one of the pleasure cruises of the Hamburg-American liner Victoria Luise, shows the station out of rush hours.
