

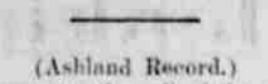

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JACKSON COUNTY PREACHERS SEEK DRYEST OREGON

(Ashland Record.) Pursuant to the call of the pastors of the local churches in Ashland, the ministers of Jackson county met in the Presbyterian church at 12 o'clock Tuesday, February 17.

The ministers present were Vernon, Spencer, Creevy, Costlett, Bailie, Reames, Douglass, Schwinsky, Browning, Vater, Shields, Morgan, Johnson, Foskett and Carnahan.

After luncheon Rev. Douglass of Ashland stated the purpose of the gathering—to organize a non-partisan organization to promote the "Oregon dry" campaign.

The call was also issued to all temperance workers of Jackson county to meet in Medford, March 2, at 11 o'clock in the public library for the purpose of getting together in an organization to fight for the constitutional amendment for Oregon Dry in 1914.

The association also appointed a committee to memorialize young people's organizations to join with all workers in this statewide campaign.

Dr. Carnahan, Rev. Browning and J. F. Vernon were appointed a committee to frame a resolution and send it to the Christian Endeavor convention assembled at Albany.

ALONG THE RIGHT LINES

THE recent hog and dairy demonstration train sent out by the co-operation of the Southern Pacific and the Oregon Agricultural college was most successful.

The Southern Pacific has followed up the good work of the demonstration train by publication of a booklet entitled, "Pacific Northwest Swine Husbandry."

The railroad is to be congratulated upon the success of the initial moves to stir up interest in the neglected industries—but the work should not stop there.

Organized effort should be made, assisted by every factor in the community, to help the producer help himself and the country by increasing the livestock industry of the valley, as well as securing more extensive development by means of more diversified farming.

How Much Spray Material Do I Need?

Table with columns for Age, Pear Trees, Apple Trees, Peach and Apricot. Rows show spray requirements for different tree ages (1-3 years, 3-4 years, etc.).

The following table has been prepared to aid the fruitgrowers of the valley in estimating the quantity of spray material for trees of various ages. The best that can be done in a table of this kind is to give the average amount necessary for well grown trees.

Supposing the above 1000 trees are to be sprayed with arsenate of lead. As before, 3000 gallons of spray will be necessary, and since arsenate of lead is used at the rate of 4 pounds to 100 gallons of water (or what is the same, 1 pound to 25 gallons of water), the number of pounds of arsenate of lead which will be necessary may be found by dividing 3000 by 25.

High Tribute Paid Senator Chamberlain
