PERFECT SCORE RESPONSIBLE FOR DE PALMA'S VICTORY

SANTA MONICA, Cal., Feb. 27.—A perfect mechanical score enabled Ralph De Palma to capture the Vanderbilt cup yesterday for the second consecutive time, according to the verdict today of automobile experts gathered here for the races. De Palma's rare judgment and brilliant bursts of speed when pressed by his opponents were factors in the result, it was admitted, but the fact that he completed the 294 miles of the race without a stop stands as the most noteworthy achievement of the race. Barney Oldfield, runner-up, who forced De Palma to the limit in the most gruelling, heartbreaking duel ever seen on a southern California track, divided public commendation today with the winner. In spite of three visits to the pits, Oldfield finished but one minute and twenty seconds behind De Palma, who traveled the route in 3 hours, 53 minutes and 41 seconds, at an average speed of 75.5 miles an hour, breaking the Vanderbilt cup record. Oldfield and De Palma will renew their aerial battle in the International Grand Prix tomorrow, but they will have to contend with other speed masters who were forced out of yesterday's contest by mechanical troubles. Furthermore, Teddy Tetzlaff, holder of the American road race record of better than 78 miles an hour, made on the same course, will be an added entrant in the Grand Prix.

AUTHOR OF TITANIC MEMORIAL COMING

At the time of the Titanic disaster, when the whole world was aghast at the soul-rending catastrophe and aroused to express itself in heroic record, Frederick Preston Search, then a student in Germany, was chosen by Dr. Gustav Schreck, the greatest harmonist of the world, with whom the young American had spent five years in composition study, to write the Titanic memorial service for a great concert to be held in the old church of John Sebastian Bach in old Leipzig. The young composer had only four days to write the music. At the announced hour, 4000 people crowded into the famous old church to hear the music; hundreds were turned away; 4000 more attended a second concert two days later, and 4000 more heard its third presentation the following week. This performance made Frederick Preston Search famous as a rising composer in Germany. Within one week he was called on to prepare four different editions for print, all of which were rushed into circulation, within that time by rival publishing firms. The Page theater has been secured for Mr. Search's concert in Medford.
