CLEETON CANDIDATE FOR SUPREME COURT

Judge T. J. Cleeton of Portland, who has been taking Judge Calkins' place this week, is candidate for the supreme court, on the following common sense platform:

To eliminate, as far as possible, technicality and delay in the hearing and determination of cases.

To recognize and give effect to the fact that the law was made to serve the people and protect the welfare of society.

To decide matters upon the strength of the plea.

To consider justice superior to precedent.

To consider and interpret law in the light of modern conditions and the needs of modern society, with justice as the sole aim and end.

ORCHARDISTS' JUNKET WILL COST \$75 PER PERSON

A. S. Rosenbaum, chairman of the committee recently appointed to arrange for a junket of local orchardists to other fruit districts in the northwest, has received the data from John M. Scott, general passenger agent, and figures that the trip can be made for \$75 including all expenses.

Mr. Scott reported, however that the O. R. and N. would not make any reduction in the trip from Portland to Spokane with stop-overs and including the Yakima trip the round trip fare from Portland would be \$22.35.

With the elimination of North Yakima and including Hood River, Wenatchee, Kennewick and Walla Walla the fare round trip could be reduced to \$29.80.

The Pullman expense would amount to about \$1.50 a day or \$10.50 for seven days, bringing the total to \$40.30.

WEST TO WORK FOR CRATER LAKE ROADS

A letter received from Governor West, who leaves for Washington today, states that one of the first things he will look after when at the nation's capital is the Crater Lake park appropriation, so as to secure \$100,000 additional for the road work now in progress.

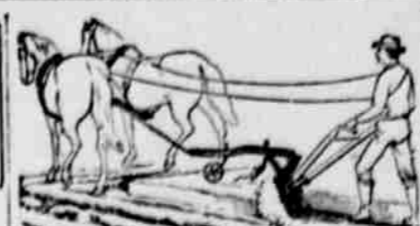
