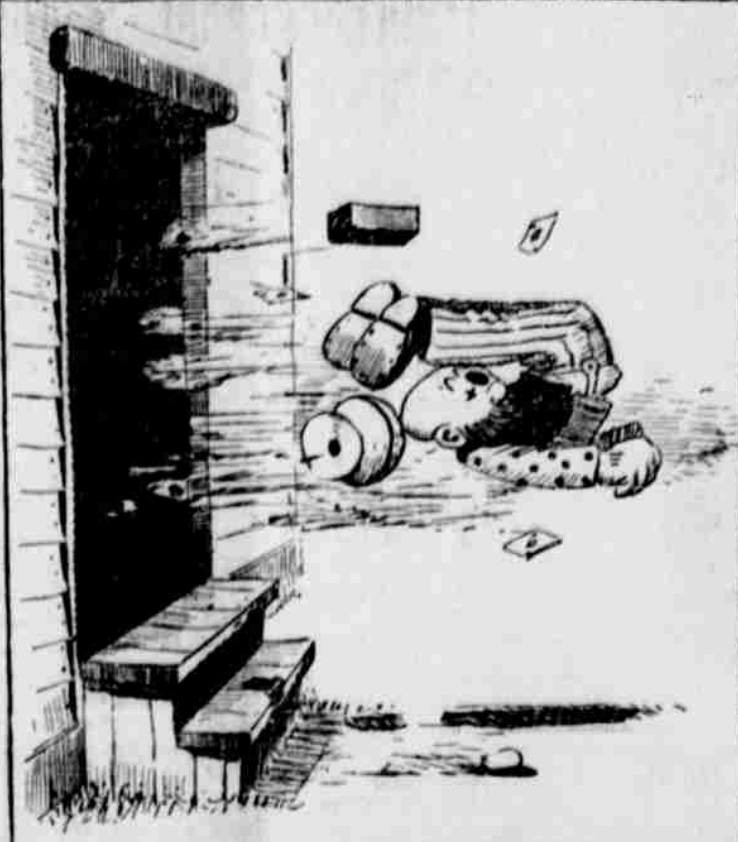

RECORDS BROKEN FOR STOCK RECEIPTS PORTLAND, OREGON

PORTLAND, Or., March 2.—All records for livestock receipts were broken at the North Portland yards today, with 146 earloads, 58 in excess of the previous high record made. The shipments included 2763 cattle, 4568 hogs and 2174 sheep. Almost every state west of the Rocky mountains was represented. In the face of the heavy shipments, hogs opened 10 cents lower. Twenty-nine cars from Huntington and nine from Ontario, Or., were consigned to Miller & Lux of San Francisco.
