#### PENDLETON FACES WARFARE AFTER EVANGELIST'S VISIT

PENDLETON, Ore., March 4. At a mass meeting last night the Rev. J. Bulgin announced before 2500 persons in the tabernacle that he had consulted over the telephone with Miss Fern Hobbs in Governor West's office in Salem and that she had assured the Law and Orger League of Pendleton that if the local officers do not immediately act upon the charges of alleged official graft in gambling, prostitution and liquor violations, state troops will be sent here and the city declared under martial law until the conditions are cleaned up. The Rev. Bulgin called the meeting of the vigilance committee for tomorrow to formulate the campaign.

Rev. Dr. A. I. Lucas of Walla Walla, in lectures tonight denounced the formation of the vigilance committee by the Law and Order League as "extra legal, unconstitutional and anarchical.
