

TERRAZAS PLANS TO GIVE SELF UP TO SAVE HIS SON

EL PASO, Texas, Mar. 6.—General Luis Terrazas' friends here were trying today to dissuade him from going to Chihuahua City to give himself up to General Villa as a hostage for his son, Luis Junior, a prisoner in the rebels' hands. Villa is not the man, it was argued, to appreciate the offer of such a sacrifice, and it undoubtedly would cost the father's life without saving the son's.

Terrazas, senior, has exerted himself to the utmost, but vainly, to raise the \$500,000 in Mexican money which Villa was reported to have demanded of him if he wanted to prevent his son from being driven ahead of the rebels, in their prospective attack on Torreon, which would almost certainly mean his death.

Though rated at \$40,000,000 before the rebellion broke out, the elder Terrazas' circumstances have been straightened by rebel confiscations of his property until \$500,000 Mexican proved an impossible sum for him to raise.

POSTUM INVENTOR TO LOSE APPENDIX

ROCHESTER, Minn., Mar. 6.—Charles W. Post, the cereal food magnate, arrived here today to have his vermiform appendix removed at the Mayo sanitarium. The trip from Santa Barbara took just 6 hours and 25 minutes. It had not been decided at exactly what hour to operate.

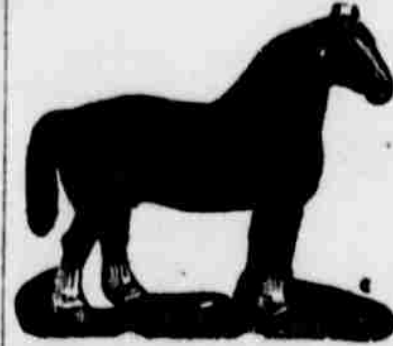
