TERRAZA ASKS U. S. AID TO SAVE SON FROM DEATH

EL PASO, March 6.—General Luis Terraza today appealed to Mariona Letcher, the American consul at Chihuahua now here awaiting instructions, to save his son Luis whose life has been declared forfeited if 500,000 pesos ransom was not paid General Villa, the rebel leader. Letcher was deeply moved by the appeal but said he was helpless in the matter. "I am 80 years old and neither life nor money means much to me," said Terraza with trembling voice. "My son has 13 children and they need him. I would gladly return to Chihuahua and Villa could kill me instead of my son."

RUMOR THAT HUERTA IS TO LEAD ARMY

MEXICO CITY, March 6.—It is again rumored that General Huerta soon will leave the presidency to assume command of the army in the north. Part of the rumored plan is that he will run for the presidency in the July election. Should Huerta vacate the presidency, the present formation of the cabinet would leave Jose Lopez Portillo Y. Rojas, minister of foreign affairs, as president.

WHEAT DEALS NOT MONOPOLY IS PLEA

WASHINGTON, March 6.—Defense of the Chicago board of trade and the Minneapolis chamber of commerce against the charges they are tools of combinations arbitrarily controlling wheat prices began today before the house rules committee. Henry Robbins, counsel for the Chicago board, told the committee the organizations were not and could not be involved in grain monopoly because they were not engaged in commercial enterprises.
