

COUNTIES REFUSE TO PAY FARES OF UNEMPLOYED ARMY

SACRAMENTO, Mar. 13.—We will spend one million dollars for defense, but not a cent for tribute." —District Attorney Waechurst of Sacramento county.

"Yolo county will not spend a five cent piece to have these men out." —Sheriff Monroe of Yolo county.

These statements from the officers of the two counties involved over the handling of the unemployed army of about 1000 men camped on the river bank opposite Sacramento, expressed the situation as it stands today.

Yolo county offers to disband the army—notwithstanding the statement of the men that they will refuse to move in small groups to different parts of the state—providing that the Sacramento people furnish the railroad fares. Sacramento will refuse to spend a penny for railroad fare for the unemployed to move them in any direction, but is spending about \$400 a day to guard the bridges leading into this city.

A row is on between the two counties, and in the meantime the unemployed army is still camped under pleasant surroundings, but living on short rations. Public sentiment is turning to such an extent that considerable food is being donated to the camp, and sufficient for the time elapsed since the riot on Monday to allow the agents of the unemployed in other cities to raise money with which to contribute something toward the food supply of the workless horde, which is determined to march on toward Washington.

FAIRBANKS SPEAKS IN BEHALF OF PEACE

LON BEACH, Cal., Mar. 13.—"Christianity is making for peace in this world, and anyone trying to involve our Christian nation in war with any other nation will have a difficult task," said Former Vice President Chas. W. Fairbanks, addressing the state Y. M. C. A. convention here today. "The ruling power of Japan does not entertain a thought of hostility toward the United States. Japan wants to hold respect of this country. The people are friendly toward us. Any one flaunting the war flag between these nations is not a leader of Christianity."

NEW MINISTER CHRISTIAN CHURCH ARRIVES TODAY

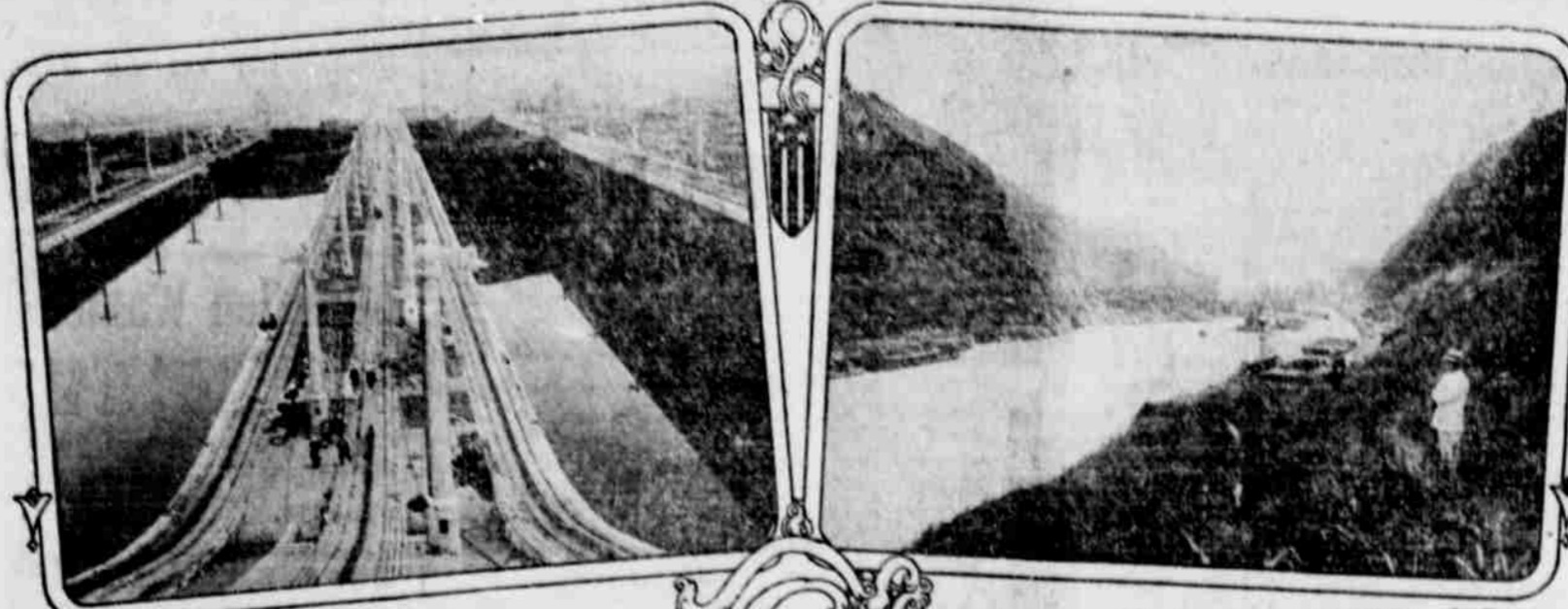

He will hold services each night next week to get acquainted with the congregation and people generally to see whether he wants to accept the call and for the congregation to decide whether they want to retain him.

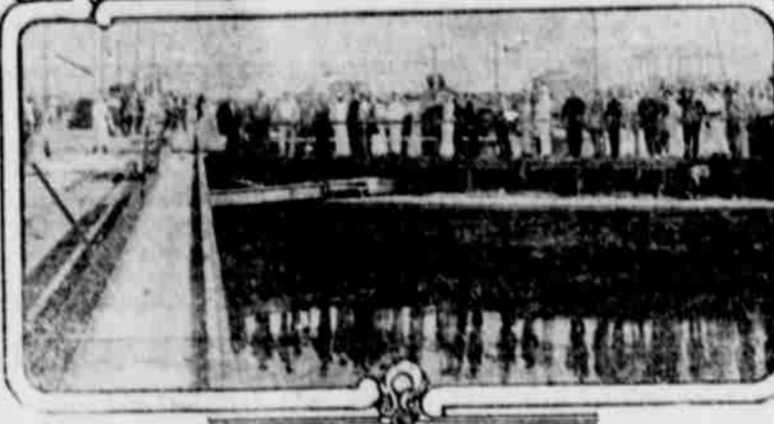
Miss Florence Hazelrigg, very popular in Medford musical circles, has accepted the leadership of the choir, which means the music will be first class.

The call of the Caribbean sea is especially potent during the winter months, attracting thousands of tourists from all parts of the country. The most popular of these is the four-passenger touring car. A striking exemplar of streamline symmetry, it has power to spare for hill-climbing, rough going and country driving; for congested city travel a flexible throttle of four to fifty miles an hour. Its low center of gravity, perfect balance, comfortably tilted seats, special rear axle construction and springs make it a wonderfully easy riding vehicle.

The torpedo roadster, with its dashing snappy style, has a special charm for the younger motorists. It also appeals to men of business, men of professions, whose duties take them daily out of doors.
