Car No. 1 of the Southern Oregon Traction company, the first streetcar to be introduced into Southern Oregon, arrived Friday night from St. Louis, after having a narrow es cape from being burned in the mil lion dollar dock fire at Portland this week. The ear will be in operation by the end of next week. The work of stringing trolley wires on East Main began this morning.

The ear attracted considerable attention and some criticism. Many expected it to be as long as a Pullman sleeper and fitted up the same. However, it is modern, with the payas-you-enter system, and able to handle the Medford traffic for some time. All the modern attachments to street ears are there. It is painted yellow and is officially known as the West Main car.

The ear will be left on the flat car until Monday morning, when it will be unloaded.
