TROLLEY CAR FOR BULLIS LINE ARRIVES IN CITY

Car No. 1 of the Southern Oregon Traction company, the first street-car to be introduced into Southern Oregon, arrived Friday night from St. Louis, after having a narrow escape from being burned in the million dollar dock fire at Portland this week.

U. S. EXPRESS COMPANY GIVES UP THE GHOST

NEW YORK, Mar. 14.—The directors of the United States Express company voted unanimously today to liquidate its affairs and dissolve in the shortest possible time.

The precise means for realizing on the company's assets were not disclosed but it is thought a syndicate will be formed to take them over so they may be disposed of to the best advantage.

Persons familiar with the company's assets assert the return to shareholders will be from \$90 to \$100 a share.

The parcel post's success and the recent interstate commerce commission order making a 16 per cent reduction in express charges are held directly responsible for the company's retirement after sixty years of operation.

ST. VITUS DANCERS

IT takes all kinds of cranks to make the world, and they throw all kinds of spasms. The morning's mail brings several, or rather the regular weekly installment of prolonged spasms.

One of these is from the "International Information Bureau," F. X. Weinschenk, manager, with headquarters at Washington, D. C. The business of this press bureau seems to be to persistently call the president's attention to the "damnable conspiracy" alleged to exist among the Masons of the world to rule the United States for the benefit of England.

I would respectfully suggest, Mr. President, that you, as the official head of the nation, personally appear before a joint assembly of congress and senate and submit the following charges, viz: "That the British government constitutes the head of International Free Masonry, and secretly holds corporate wealth in common with Masons in this country."

The Menace, simply an unfair appeal to prejudice and bigotry of a forgotten day, is a step backwards three hundred years. It reads like the broadsides that deluged the gutter in the days of the gunpowder plot when every papist was regarded as a traitor. It seems incredible that so much vicious and malicious slush should secure circulation in this day and age.

No wonder we have to maintain lunatic asylums when such St. Vitus dancers find a following.

ASKS PRISON AS VACATION FROM WIFE

LOS ANGELES, Cal., March 14.—Alexander Krystosiek demanded a six months' jail sentence today so that he might have a "vacation from Mrs. Krystosiek."

Krystosiek had been haled into court to answer to a battery charge preferred by his wife. He immediately informed the judge that he wanted to plead guilty and prayed a six months' sentence. The matter was taken under advisement.

PLAY EDUCATION AS STOCK SELLING SCHEME

BOSTON, March 14.—Sharp criticism and vigorous defense of the International Correspondence Schools at Scranton, Pa., and their relations with corporations which have a capital of over \$100,000,000, were voiced before the legislative committee on mercantile affairs today. It was claimed that education was being prostituted for marketing stocks through the scholarship agents. The school's friends scored its opponents as interested for a material reason in injuring the stocks in question and flatly denied that the schools had any physical connection with other corporations.

M'MINNVILLE COLLEGE WINS IN STATE DEBATE

ALBANY, Ore., Mar. 14.—Chas. Scott of McMinnville college was chosen president of the Oregon Inter-Collegiate Oratorical association today and Marion Stanford of Albany college, secretary, and Ella Pickett of Pacific college treasurer. Next year's meeting and oratorical contest will be at McMinnville.

George Stewart, Jr., of McMinnville college won the Oregon inter-collegiate oratorical contest. Eight colleges participated. Leslie Hubbard of Pacific college was second, and Eric Dolt of Willamette university third.

DUSSELDORF, Germany, March 14.—Fire early today destroyed the famous thirteenth century church of St. Quirinus at Neuss, near here. The church was constructed in the year 1209 and its tower rebuilt in 1471.

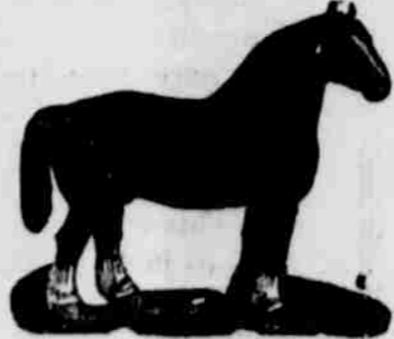
