The resolution defeated today was the first introduced in the present congress. It was presented by Sentor Chamberlain of Oregon and the woman suffrage committee later authorized Senator Ashurst to report favorably. The southern senstors lined up solidly against the amendment, contending it would complicate the negro question.
