

### SOUTHERN OREGON MOOSE CELEBRATE BIG INITIATION

Moose from Roseburg, Grants Pass, Ashland, Gold Hill and other Southern Oregon points are gathering in the city this afternoon for the celebration and initiation of 125 members tonight. 700 out of town members of the lodge will arrive in three special trains this afternoon. A banquet with plates for 700 will be held in the Nat skating rink and a monster parade given this evening at eight o'clock.

Addresses will be given by Judge Morrow of Portland, Judge Nooner of Roseburg, Attorney B. F. Mulkey of this city and others. The visiting ladies will be entertained at the Isis Theater, and later a ball will be given at the Nat with a ten piece orchestra. The Grants Pass and Gold Hill bands will furnish the music for the parade and initiations. The Grants Pass lodge will have charge of the initiation.

The celebration is one of the largest lodge events ever held in this city.

### NEBRASKANS CELEBRATE BIRTHDAY OF SECY BRYAN

LINCOLN, Neb., March 20.—Praise for President Wilson and Secretary Bryan in nearly equal measure was the dominating note in addresses last night at the annual banquet on the occasion of the fifth-fourth anniversary of Bryan's birth.

Detained at Washington by pressing official business, Bryan sent a letter saying he could look with satisfaction over the accomplishments of the first quarter of the present democratic administration.

President Wilson, he said, had more than realized the party's highest hope. The past twelve months, he said, "could be recalled with satisfaction and the future viewed with assurance."

The banquet crowd was large and representative of the element in the state party which has supported Bryan's policies. The speech making program was limited to addresses by Governor Morehead of Nebraska, Governor Cox of Ohio, Jo. S. W. Folk, former governor of Missouri, and Senator Robinson of Arkansas.

### COUNTY JAIL SENTENCES FOR FUEL OFFICIALS

SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.—Three Western Fuel company officials recently convicted of conspiracy to defraud the Government, were given jail sentences tonight by federal Judge Dooling. James Smith, vice-president and general manager, was sentenced to a year and a half in San Quentin and fined \$5000. Fred Mills, superintendent was also sentenced to a year and a half and Edward Mayer, a weigher, sentenced to a year in the Alameda county jail.

### IMPEACHMENT OF JAPANESE CABINET AGAIN ATTEMPTED

TOKYO, March 20.—Impeachment of the Japanese cabinet was again attempted in the lower house of parliament today by the anti-government coalition of lawmakers.

It was based on the navy graft scandal, which was referred to as "a stain on the newly begun reign and harmful to the navy's prestige at home and abroad." The administration was charged with negligence in investigations.

The impeachment attempt was the second made since navy graft accusations were first made, and although the first one failed, many persons believed public opinion has changed so much as a result of the scandal that the present one will be successful.

to a vote every six years. They wanted the question settled for ever by one vote.

There have been rumors for some time that the Liberal-Labor-Irish alliance in parliament was crumbling. Andrew Bonar Law, the Conservative leader, evidently decided to test these reports, which, if true, would have meant home rule's certain defeat.

Accordingly, he moved in the House of Commons a vote censuring the administration for its Irish policy. This motion was lost, 345 to 252. It was that vote which precipitated today's situation in Ulster.

### YEGGMEN WRECK POSTOFFICE SAFE

IRVINGTON, Cal., March 20.—Completely wrecking the interior of the postoffice here, two dynamite explosions early today shattered the safe doors, the flying pieces of metal completing the destruction of the letter racks and furnishings of the office. The crackers escaped with \$75 in coin. Stamps and registered mail were left untouched.

It is believed that the robbers escaped in an automobile, the tracks where the machine was turned showing in front of the building.

That no more loss was sustained was due to the fact that the bulk of the money in the office was banked late yesterday.

### GENERAL OF HOBOES IN DURANCE VILE

LOS ANGELES, Cal., March 20.—Martin Rose's unemployed army was deprived of its leader today when the police took Rose into custody on a charge of begging. Rose vehemently denied the charge, explaining that he had earned \$28 found in his pocket by working in a printing shop.

### O. A. C. STUDENT DIES AFTER DOING FACULTY CANOE TEST

CORVALLIS, Ore., March 20.—Fred Young, a senior in the Oregon Agricultural college from Collins Hot Springs, Wash., died here today of typhoid pneumonia, the outcome of a plunge in the cold water at a mill race as part of a test given by the college authorities to candidates for permission to engage in canoeing.

### LOBBYIST ADMITS BEING PAID BY PRISON CONTRACTOR

WASHINGTON, Mar. 20.—Admission that he had been in the employ of prison contractors since 1908 to oppose national legislation hampering prison contract work was made here today before the senate lobby probers by Edward Boyle of Chicago, former treasurer of the National Conference of Charities and Corrections. He also admitted that he now was opposing the Hughes bill intended to hamper inter-state shipments of convict-made goods.

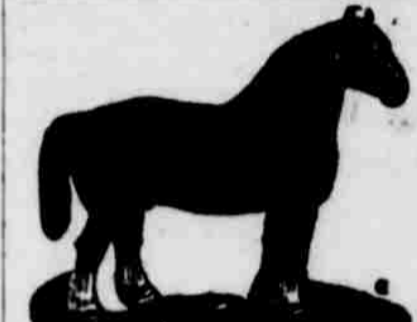
