BAKER, Ore., Mar. 25.—Every saloonkeeper in business in Copperfield when Governor West declared martial law early in January because of alleged lawlessness, is under indictment by the Baker county grand jury today on charges of selling liquor to minors. In all twenty-five indictments were returned by the inquisitorial body which adjourned last night after a prolonged session. Some of the indictments were for saloonmen in other parts of Baker county other than Copperfield.

Despite the testimony of Frank H. Snodgrass, special investigator for Governor West William Wiegand was not indicted on the charge of displaying improper pictures in his saloon at Copperfield.
