### THE REAL ISSUE

THE history of England is the old story of privilege striving to perpetuate itself.

For centuries the struggle was the crown versus the barons. When the barons had killed themselves off fighting for the crown, the crown created a new baronage, and it became the crown versus parliament, which emerged triumphant when Charles the First fell.

The restoration restored privilege, but the crown never regained its prestige and lost its remaining power in the revolution of 1679 when William of Orange was called to the throne to replace the banished James the Second.

Since the time of the great Dutchman, the power of the kingship has atrophied. No king has mixed in party affairs and tried to dominate politics without disastrous results to himself and the nation. George the Third alone persisted in it. And now comes another George repeating the performance. To the king's meddling is due the muddle of home rule, the reinstatement of disloyal officers and the crisis which is likely to wreck the Liberal coalition.

For centuries England has been exploited for the benefit of the all-powerful classes. Her farm lands have been withdrawn from agriculture to make hunting grounds for the nobility. Along with a brigade of peers, she has produced an army of paupers. The real needs of the people seem comprehended alone by Lloyd George, the greatest constructive statesman of the day.

Ulster is simply the excuse for a rallying point for privilege. The attack on the landed interests, on the House of Lords, the curtailment of aristocracy's power is the real issue. Home rule is, of course, obnoxious to priviege, but the cause of Ulster would not cause king and army to intercede, were it not that the citadel of privilege itself is assailed along the line.

The British people are ultra-conservative and full of religious bigotry. It may require several years more of effort for the Liberal policies to become successful-but that they will eventually, no one who has studied English history can doubt.


