

DRYS PLAN MOST VIGOROUS CAMPAIGN FOR A WET COAST

WESTERVILLE, O., April 2.—The campaign that is being waged by the Anti-Saloon League of America in Washington, California, Oregon and Colorado for statewide prohibition is a part of the general program of that organization for national prohibition.

During April and May, the strongest orators the league can secure are to hold great mass meetings at all the principal western points as "openers" for the general contest that will be waged.

Ernest H. Cherrington, general manager of the more than forty periodicals of the league, is now on the coast making business arrangements in the four states for the details of the campaign. A part of this program will be the installation of a four-state literary bureau at either Seattle or Portland, in which a force of writers and cartoonists will be employed to furnish every newspaper in these pivotal states with up-to-date information regarding the progress of the fight.

It is a part of this national program, also, that led up to the decision, a few days ago, to establish a dry daily newspaper at Washington, D. C., the first issue of which will be on the day that congress meets in December. With this daily, and with the forty weeklies and bi-weeklies, the league proposes to carry the fight for a saloonless nation into every congressional district in the United States.

TO FORCE KLAMATH TO ACCEPT WARRANTS

KLAMATH FALLS, April 2.—An attempt was made yesterday by the Southern Pacific company to force County Treasurer J. W. Siemens to accept \$10,000 in contested warrants as a part of that company's taxes, which amount in all to \$23,193.24.

In accordance with the ruling of the state tax commission, Treasurer Siemens refused to accept these warrants, which were for \$5,000 each. This move had apparently been anticipated, and a writ of alternative mandamus was filed by Stone & Gale, attorneys for the Southern Pacific company.

In the original complaint the Southern Pacific company places the assessed valuation of its property in Klamath county at \$858,726. Of its total taxation, \$23,193.24, cash to the amount of \$12,793.24 was tendered in payment, the balance being in warrants.

OLYMPIA DARK TO SAVE \$600 A MONTH

OLYMPIA, Wash., April 2.—Olympia, will be in total darkness at night if the city officials have their way. The council accepted the recommendation of the mayor to cut out street lighting and save \$600 a month.
