Ed Pence and family are camped at Perry Foster's, cooking for Dave Pence's road crew.

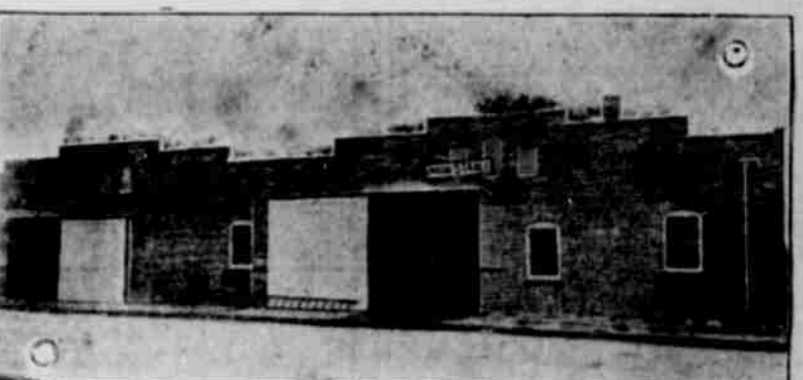

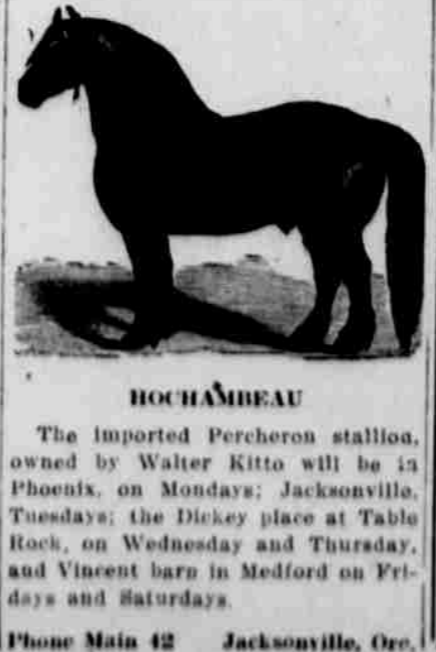
