WASHINGTON, April 6 .- Drastically toned down, revised drafts of the administration's anti-trust bills will be submitted to congress this week, it was announced today.

The lawmakers who are handling them have received instructions in speed matters up as much as possible but the opinion was gaining ground that several of the bills may be shelved for the session and the antitrust program curtailed or perhaps even postponed in the interests, of an early adjournment, so that congressmen may get back to their publican nomination as sheriff at the constituencies and look after their primaries May 15. political fences.
