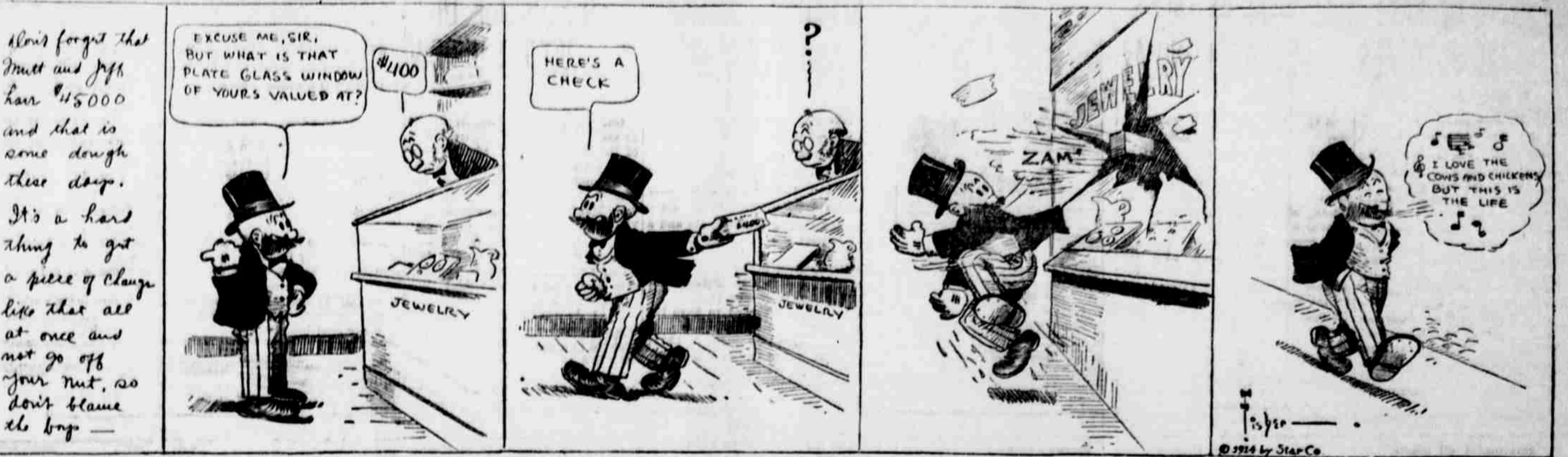

HOME RULE BILL GAINS IN COMMONS

LONDON, April 7.—By 80 majority the amendment for the rejection of the home rule bill was defeated in the house of commons last night and without a division the bill was given for the third time for its second reading.

Announcement of the figures evoked louder cheers from the opposition than from the ministerialists, the opposition interpreting it as gratifying proof of the dwindling government majority.

But the diminution is accounted for to some extent by the abstaining from voting of the O'Brienites. The speeches today were much more conciliatory than those which marked the bill's earlier passages.
