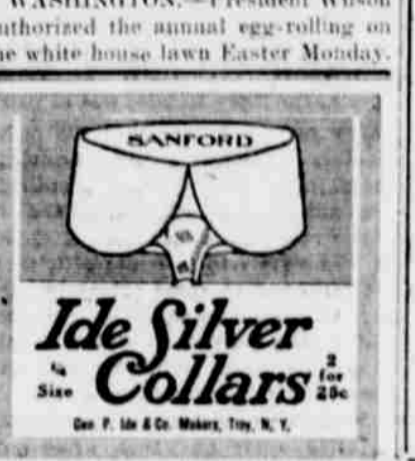
## TALE OF PURCHASE OF BARNUM ROAD BY HILL, FICTION

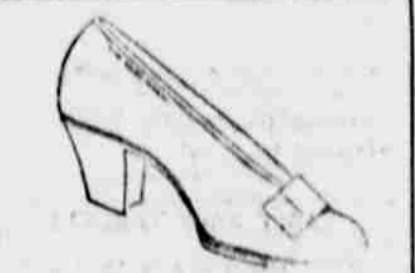
