TRIO OF ROBBERS CAUGHT AFTER BATTLE

STOCKTON, Cal., April 10.—August Melsky probably will die from a bullet wound through his lung, and Tom Shay and a woman giving the name of Mrs. L. C. Gregory of Roseville are in jail here, following a desperate battle with Detective Frank Fredericks early today.

Fredericks traced the three to a lodging house after a Greek who had been held up gave him a description of the trio. Entering the room, the alleged robbers tried to shoot the officer, and when their weapons missed fire, they pounced upon him and gave him a severe beating. As they started to run, Fredericks managed to secure his own gun and shot Melsky as he was going through the door. Shay was captured by lodgers attracted by the shots, and the woman was dragged from under a bed in another room. The woman is said to have confessed to the robbery.

WASHINGTON PLANS TO RESTORE DEATH PENALTY

OLYMPIA, Wash., April 10.—That sentiment is rapidly forming in opposition to the abolition of the death penalty in this state as provided in the Goss bill passed by the last legislature, and that as a result a bill will be introduced at the 1915 session designed to repeal the existing statute, is the belief becoming prevalent here today among many state officials and others interested in the matter. The unusual epidemic of crime that has been recorded in western Washington during three months of which a score or more of lives were taken, is held responsible for the growth of the sentiment.

WILSON FIGHTING MONOPOLY

MANY of those who oppose repeal of the Panama canal tolls exemption clause do so under the impression that the exemption granted American coastwise ships is in the nature of a subsidy to encourage the creation of an American merchant marine, and it is argued that such favorable legislation is essential if America is ever to regain her lost glory as a ship-owning nation.

It is true that before the civil war Americans owned a large portion of the merchant vessels of the world. Yankee ships were familiar sights everywhere. Today they are seldom seen. American ships are comparatively few and coast shipping is in the hands of a trust or monopoly.

It is true that toll exemption is in the nature of a subsidy, but coastwise traffic is already limited by law to American vessels, and it would simply be a double bonus to the ship trust. Besides, free tolls are obnoxious as special legislation at the expense of the people. Free passage is a privilege not granted at the Suez canal, at the Manchester canal or any other canal, by the nation building the canal.

If subsidies are needed to create a merchant marine, then let us offer subsidies—but subsidies never yet created a merchant marine. What has killed America's shipping is restrictive legislation. A glance at the history of shipping tells the story.

In 1860 a third of the world's shipping floated the Stars and Stripes. During the civil war, confederate privateers destroyed much, the balance being transferred, for protection, to the flags of other nations that permitted free registration.

In 1866 congress passed a law barring from America and registration under the American flag, any American-built ship licensed or authorized to sail under a foreign flag. This effectually disposed of what shipping the rebels had not destroyed.

In 1870 coasting ships were exempted from payment of "tonnage" taxes imposed upon all American ships engaged in foreign trade for the use of improved ports and harbors, which taxes go to the upkeep of improvements costing millions.

In 1872 congress passed a law barring from America and registration under the American flag, any American-built ship licensed or authorized to sail under a foreign flag. This act also compelled American ships sailing to foreign ports to go before a federal commissioner and make a written contract with each man and on the return voyage to go to the same office to settle with each person employed.

All the important items, especially machinery, used in ship construction for foreign trade must pay full duty—other nations admit ship materials free. But the ships built for foreign trade in America are forbidden from engaging for more than two months in any year in the coasting trade. As a result of these laws, no ships have been built for foreign trade in many years.

The coast shipping trust has by legislation perfected its monopoly by effectually killing the American merchant marine. The remnants of the old merchant marine, left after the civil war, were permanently exiled. The building of new vessels has been rendered impossible by prohibitive tariff upon materials. The operation of ships to foreign shores has been made unprofitable by unreasonable and discriminatory legislation.

The coast shipping monopoly has had itself exempted from the operation of the laws that killed American shipping. It is exempted from tonnage taxes, from employing American citizens, from unreasonable contract regulations. It is protected absolutely from foreign competition. And now it is fighting for exemption of Panama canal tolls—which are essential to make the canal, built by the people, self-sustaining and keep it from being a further financial burden.

It is monopoly that has ruined America's once great merchant marine—and it is monopoly whose demand for special privilege at the canal is being fought by President Wilson, and it is this same insolent monopoly that hides itself behind the American flag and shrieks patriotism when it seeks public favor.

GUNMEN TO DIE AT DAWN MONDAY

NEW YORK, April 10.—Friends of the four New York gunmen sentenced to die in the Sing Sing electric chair, April 13, for the murder of Gambler Herman Rosenthal, planned today to make another effort for a new trial. They expected to appeal to the state supreme court for a stay of execution and retrial on the ground that fresh evidence had been discovered. Rabbi Browne was said to be backing the movement. The four condemned men were said to have given up all hope. Prison officials planned to execute them at dawn next Monday.
