It was stated at the white house late today that President Wilson had not even considered a call for volunteers. He believes the regular army, the navy and the militia will be able to cope with the situ-.

BEAR ATTACK SENDS STOCKS TO LOW LEVEL

NEW YORK, April 24. The stock market opened under bear pressure against the speculative leaders. Heavy selling depressed several issues to the lowest level for the movement. The bear attack was based on the news from Mexico, coupled with a slump to the London market. Canadian Pacific fell 21/2, touching the lowest price in four years. There were a score of onepoint losses. Mexican Petroleum was off 5.

Bonds were irregular. The market closed heavy.
