

## FORMER MEDFORD MAN MANUFACTURES AUTOMOBILE TIRES

An Oakland California paper contains the following account of the establishment of the first automobile tire factory on the coast by George L. Davis, formerly of Medford:

"Following up its advantageous position in the motor world, Oakland is soon to have a big, real, live automobile tire factory, according to the plans of the Davis-Fry Manufacturing company, a company recently incorporated for \$5,000,000 for the purpose of manufacturing the Hercules automobile tires.

"The company has already ordered the necessary machinery from the east with which to build tires at the rate of 80 a day, according to P. C. Steinmetz, an expert tire maker, who came here from the east recently and has been building test tires along the lines of the patent process under which the Hercules tires will be made. Steinmetz has made quite a few of the Hercules tires at the company's Emeryville plant and found them ideal in every respect. He says:

"The officers of the company believe that the Hercules tire is not only a superior tire, but by costly demonstration has proved to their satisfaction that the Hercules tire is the very best tire yet invented; the special points of excellence being: first, durability; second, non-skid, both of which features are produced by the thread, or grain, of the tread of the tire running at nearly acute angles with the roadbed instead of parallel thereto.

"The company guarantees the Hercules tire to run a distance of 5000 miles ordinary travel over ordinary roads, although it has been demonstrated that these tires in some instances have run more than 14,000 miles.

## PLENTY OF MONEY TO FINANCE CAMPAIGN: NO CALL FOR TROOPS

WASHINGTON, April 24.—Representative Fitzgerald, chairman of the house appropriations committee, conferred this afternoon with President Wilson. Later Fitzgerald said the democrats were ready to furnish unlimited funds to finance the Mexican campaign.

It was stated at the white house late today that President Wilson had not even considered a call for volunteers. He believes the regular army, the navy and the militia will be able to cope with the situation.

## BEAR ATTACK SENDS STOCKS TO LOW LEVEL

NEW YORK, April 24.—The stock market opened under bear pressure against the speculative leaders. Heavy selling depressed several issues to the lowest level for the movement. The bear attack was based on the news from Mexico, coupled with a slump in the London market. Canadian Pacific fell 2½, touching the lowest price in four years. There were a score of one-point losses. Mexican Petroleum was off 5.

Bonds were irregular. The market closed heavy.

## BOGGS REARRESTED FOR DRINKING AND BEGGING

Dave Boggs, who figured as one of the central figures in an escapade last fall with two 13 and 15-year-old girls, and was released upon parole, was arrested Thursday night by the police for being drunk and begging on the streets, and is held in the city jail pending his return to sobriety. Boggs' fall from grace will likely result in his return to the county jail to serve out his sentence.

Boggs is alleged by the police to have engaged in a drinking bout for the last week, and when his money ran out, to have begged for drinks and money.

By a unanimous vote the Boston Cigar-makers' union has levied an assessment of \$5 on each member to advertise the Boston-made union cigars this year.

## 24 MILES RAILROAD FROM POKEGAMA TO THRALL TORN UP

J. A. Frizell, who has long been in the employ of the Weyerhaeuser interests, came to Ashland this week, where his family resides, and left Tuesday for Northern California, where he will be the representative of the Weyerhaeuser Railroad company in the removal of the 24-mile railroad between Thrall and Pokégama. The rolling stock of the road was taken off during the past year with the exception of one engine and a number of cars which will be used in taking up the track, says the Ashland Record.

This abandoned railroad was bought several years ago from the Klamath Lake Lumber company, by the Weyerhaeuser interests, along with a large tract of timber for the cutting of which it was partly built. The railroad was put in at a cost of about \$1,500,000 by a timber corporation composed of Mason, Lindley and Kaufman. They built lumber mills at Klamath which burned down shortly after completion and the timber was never cut—being sold soon thereafter to the Weyerhaeusers. As Mr. Frizell puts it, "The Weyerhaeusers are now throwing away a million and a half of dollars."

The road did a general business for some time after the mills burned and it was the original idea that it would be built into Klamath Falls. The building of the eed branch of the Southern Pacific made this an unprofitable proposition. The road was also used for a time by the Pokégama Lumber company and more recently was leased to the California-Oregon Power company with the option of buying. This company recently gave up its lease.

Mr. Frizell states that the steel is still in first-class condition and will be stored at Thrall for a time—the rails being taken up from the Pokégama end. There is a steel suspension bridge over the Klamath river which will also probably have to be moved—though Mr. Frizell has hopes that it may be sold to Siskiyou county as it stands and that they may take over the old railroad grade as a wagon road. It is rock-ballasted for 24 miles and would make a splendid highway. Mr. Frizell states that he will have a crew of about 50 men on the job.
