The hog market showed some signs of weakness at the market's close as is the case at all the eastern centers. Best light sows \$5.25 to \$5.50 for the extreme top.

A fairly good demand for sheep and lambs with light receipts at close of week. Grass fed sheep are beginning to come in. Grass wethers \$5.00 to \$6.00; ewes, \$4.25 to \$4.50. Wool lambs \$6.50 to 6.75; sheared, \$5.75 to \$6.00.
