

### TO READVISE PAINTING BRIDGES ON ROGUE RIVER

Owing to a misunderstanding on the clerk's part, bids for the painting of county bridges will have to be called for over again. The advertisement read for painting the Gold Hill, Rogue River, Big Butte creek and McLeod bridges, when it should have read for the Dodge bridge instead of the Rogue River bridge.

At last month's meeting of the court, Commissioner Smith was authorized to have the Rogue River bridge adjusted and painted, upon a report from Engineer's Gerig and Kittredge that such action was necessary. V. A. Peary was employed to adjust the bridge by Commissioner Smith and while on the job painted it.

The paint was not purchased from Commissioner Leever, as currently reported. Nor, states Mr. Smith, was there any scandal or graft connected with the work. The same quality of paint was used as used on the Bybee bridge last fall.

### REQUESTS TROOPS NEAR TAMPICO

WASHINGTON, May 8.—Despite official denials, it was learned today that Admiral Mayo had asked, through Admiral Badger, for United States troops to occupy the oil territory about Tampico. He wanted them solely for purposes of protection.

Secretary of the Navy Daniels submitted a long report on the situation when the cabinet met.

Diplomats had heard that two wells, one of them belonging to the Pearson interests, burned yesterday, and a delegation of oil men with properties in the Tampico field called on Secretary Bryan and demanded protection.

### GENERAL DECLINE FORCED BY BEARS

NEW YORK, May 8.—Trading in stocks started off slowly today, with a majority of the dealings on the selling side. The bears singled out a few recently weak issues and hammered them down, causing a general decline. Canadian Pacific was the worst sufferer, dropping 2 1/2. Numerous 1 and 2-point declines followed, including Southern Pacific, B. & O., Lehigh Valley, Smelting and Mexican Petroleum. Advances from Mexico of a serious situation and weakness in European markets were used as arguments by the advocates of lower prices.

Bonds were irregular. The stock market closed irregular.

### YEAR IN PRISON FOR MILITANT FIRE-BUG

LEEDS, England, May 8.—Lillian Lenton, a militant suffragette, was sentenced today to a year's imprisonment for setting fire to Westfield house last June. It was expected she would begin a hunger strike immediately.

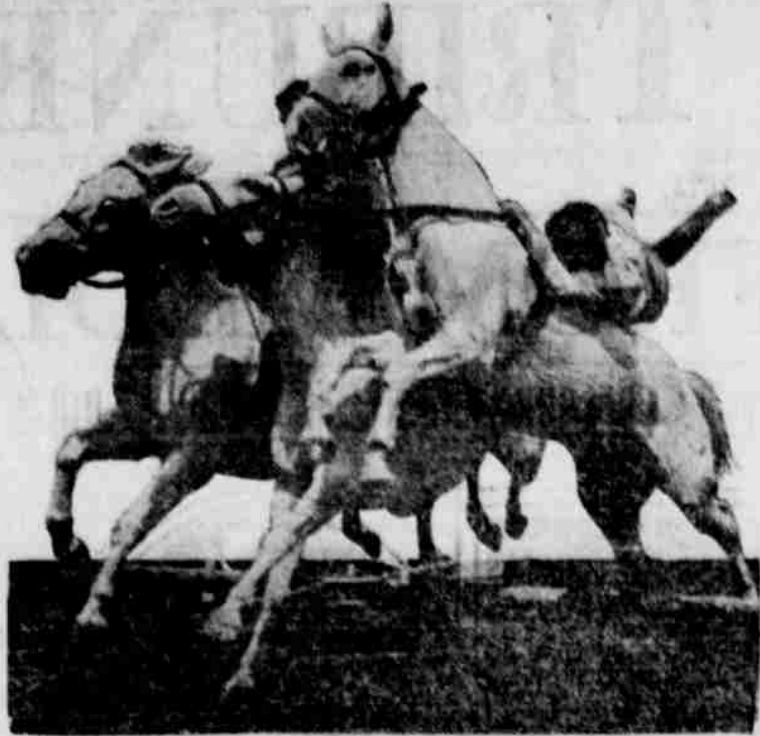

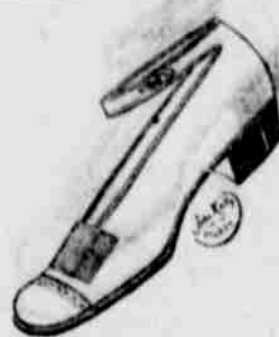
