

CLAMAN COMPANY FAREWELL SUNDAY

"East Lynne" proved as great a drawing card as ever at the opera house last night. No matter how many times one has seen this play it always bears repetition.

The Clamans gave one of the best performances of it ever seen here. Miss Miller as Isabel was especially effective in the death scene, many handkerchiefs giving ample testimony to her power to move an audience to tears.

Miss Williamson had the comedy of the play almost entirely in her hands and she made the most of her opportunities. Her portrayal of Corney was a clever bit of satire.

Mr. Seldon was a polished villain and Mr. Howland made a sympathetic Archibald. Barbara Hare, as played by Miss Mitchell was a sweet and charming creature and Lord Mount Severn, played by Mr. Raymond, was a dignified nobleman. "My Irish-American Cousin," will be the play at the matinee this afternoon and should give everyone who attends a hearty appetite for their Saturday dinner. It abounds in laughter and sentiment.

Tonight the Clamans will produce one of the cleverest comedies in their repertoire. It is "The Tyranny of Tears," and tells the story of a young married woman who always has her own way simply by crying for it. How she is cured of this bad habit is charmingly told in four acts.

"The Third Degree" will be the Clamans' farewell offering on Sunday night. This is one of the most interesting and dramatic plays ever written.

This will be the last opportunity to see the Claman company until next season, when they will return with an entirely new line of plays.

BOUNDARY BOARD DENIES PETITION

The Medford school board appeared before the school district boundary board, composed of County Superintendent J. Percy Wells and the county court, Friday and petitioned that portions of the Phoenix and Griffin creek districts be added to the Medford district, which would mean an increase in valuation of \$375,000—\$300,000 from Phoenix and \$75,000 from Griffin Creek.

The petition was denied, all the property holders of the district affected protesting. It would be a heavy increase in taxation. For instance, the Phoenix school tax is 3.5 mills, while the Medford tax is 10 mills. This would have affected orchardists and farmers as far south as the Wortman & Gore orchards and included most of the orchard belt.

W. M. Crowell appeared as attorney for the Medford school board.

The registration bureau is Wald's pharmacy, close to the postoffice.
