FRUIT OUTPUT FOR THE YEAR 1913 IS 3398 CARS

WASHINGTON, May 19.—Reports submitted at the annual meeting here today of the trustees of the North Pacific Fruit Distributors showed that in 1913 fruit growers in the Pacific Northwest had shipped 3,398 cars of fruit and 1,125 of potatoes and had derived from their sale a grand total of \$2,069,935. Apples brought an average price of \$1.26 per box.

Carload shipments made last season by the various districts comprised in the distributors' association were: Yakima 1,273, Hood River 995, Wenatchee 322, Walla Walla 396, Idaho, Oregon 595, Garfield 125, Spokane 214, and Montana 198.

With a view to facilitating the handling of fruit in western Oregon, among the Hood River district, the trustees have decided to open a branch office at Portland, Ore., with Wilmer Sieg of Hood River in charge. Sub-agencies at Medford, and other Oregon towns are contemplated.
