TRACTION CARS MASH WORKER ON RURAL ROADS

Wallace Wilson, of this city, employed by the government in building rural roads in Sams Valley was injured yesterday morning at eleven o'clock by being caught between two cars pulled by a traction engine. His right hip was smashed and his body badly bruised. Wilson, whose job it was to ride the cars and couple them together, was in between, fastening the chains together when the engineer, not knowing that he was there, backed the engine, thus jamming the cars together and catching him. At first it was thought that Wilson was hurt internally, but upon close examination it was found that his injuries were confined to his limbs. Although not seriously injured, he will be confined to his bedside for a considerable length of time.

NEW YORK, May 22.—A tablet to the memory of Ferdinand J. Kuehn, the youthful wireless operator of the Old Dominion steamship Monroe, was unveiled in public school 40 on the East Side yesterday.
