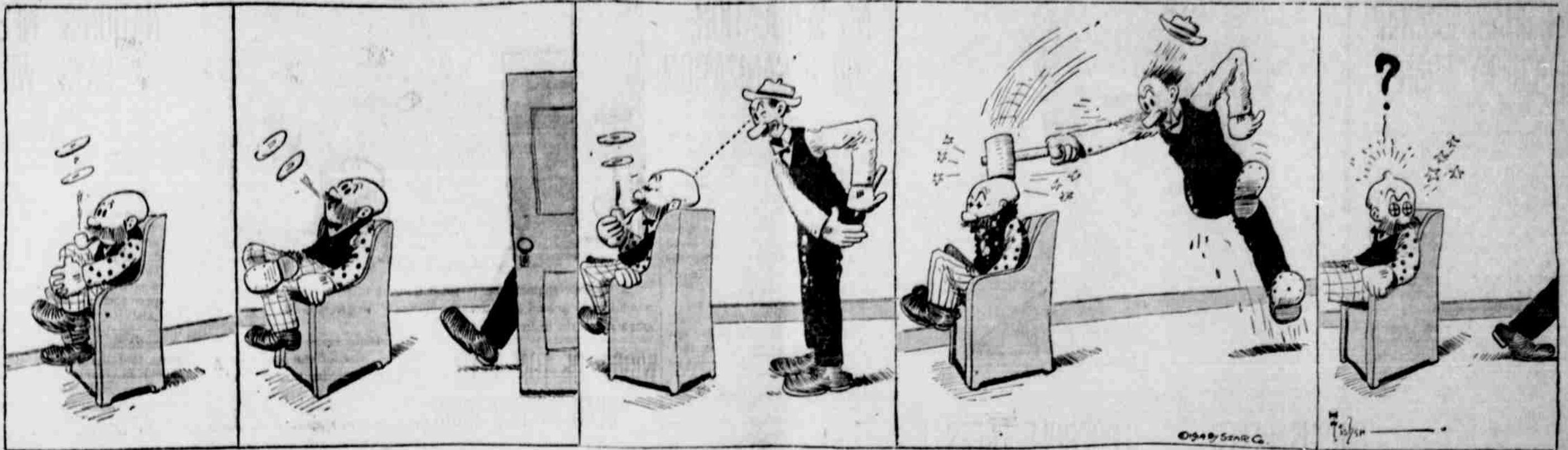


TABLE ROCK TABLETS
