BAKER, Ore., June 27.—Ed Fisher, alleged assailant of ex-Mayor Henry Stewart of Copperfield, who was shot near his home last Monday, was captured Friday near Wallola lake in mountain fastnesses by Sheriff Ed Randall, who had been constantly on his trail since the shooting occurred.
Sheriff Rand telephoned last night from Enterprise, where he had just arrived with his prisoner. He had tracked Fisher through more than forty miles of wilderness, and both fugitive and pursuer had undergone great hardship, the sheriff said.

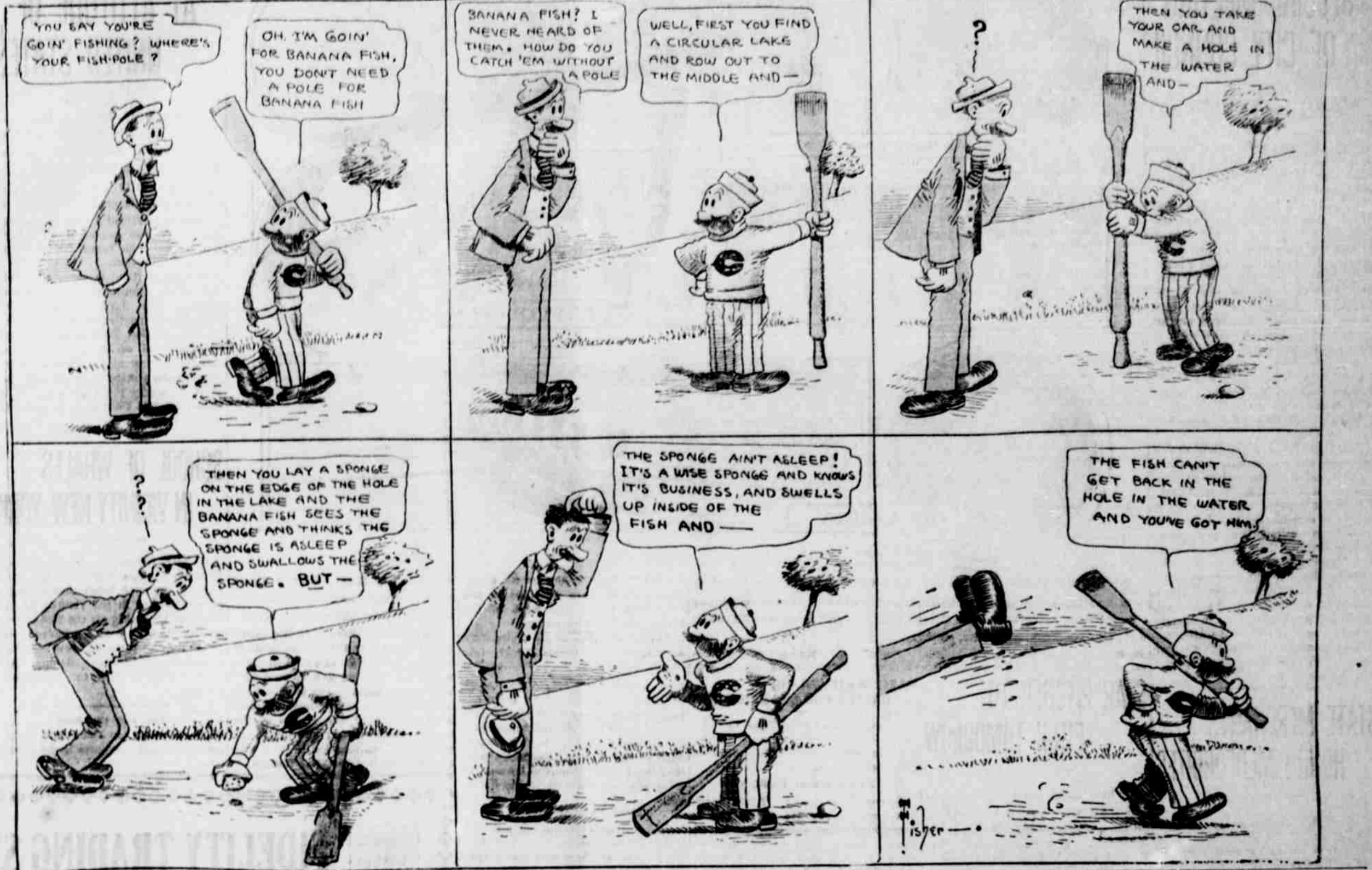
