COOPER GUILTY OF DEFRAUDING INVESTORS

NEW YORK, July 3 .- William H Cooper, formerly head of the New York Central Realty company, charged with using the mails to defraud some 800 investors out of \$475,000, was found guilty today by a jury in the federal court. Many of his victims were officers and enlisted men in the United States army and marine corps. Sentence was deferred.


