

COOPER GUILTY OF DEFRAUDING INVESTORS

NEW YORK, July 3.—William H. Cooper, formerly head of the New York Central Realty company, charged with using the mails to defraud some 800 investors out of \$475,000, was found guilty today by a jury in the federal court. Many of his victims were officers and enlisted men in the United States army and marine corps. Sentence was deferred.

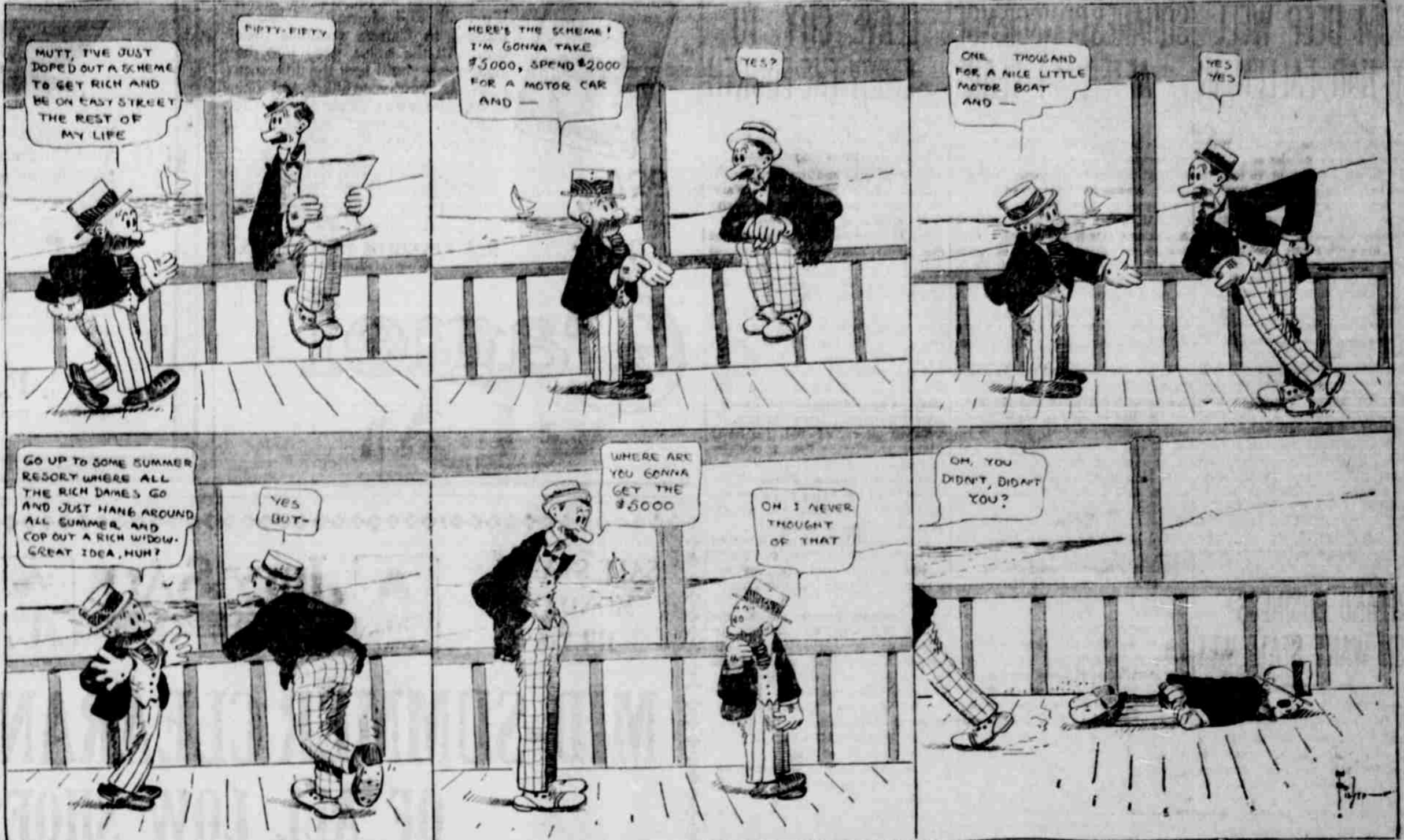
