## CRATER LAKE TRAVEL BREAKING RECORDS TRAFFIC VOLUME

Crater Lake Auto stage left Medford this morning loaded to its full capacity. Among those in the party were Dr. Albert A. White and wife of Denver, Colorado; Miss E. Jones, Miss F. Lampson and W. Dillon of Portland.

Many telegrams and letters are coming in every day to the Medford Commercial club and Hall Taxi company from tourists wishing to go to the lake. The indications are now that the tourist travel to Crater Lake this season will be greater than the Yellowstone National Park.

In a few years Crater Lake is bound to be the most famous resort in America. A conservative estimate is that fifteen thousand people will visit the lake this season, and fifty thousand next year.

Will G. Steel, superintendent of the park, is in the city and reports that all men in the park have been temporarily laid off pending passage of the civil sundry bill, containing the appropriation for the coming year. This action was taken on receipt of orders from the secretary of the interior.

Mr. Steel reports that the number of visitors to the lake this year, prior to July, were 157 as against 22 a year ago. The number of visitors to July 21, 1913, was 1143. This year to July 4 it was 628. The number of autos previous to July 4 in 1913 was nothing, this year 62 as against 156 for July a year ago.
