

BRIGADE ENCAMPMENT FOR OREGON MILITIA

PORTLAND, Ore., July 10.—Members of the quartermaster's department left here today for Gearhart, Oregon, to arrange for the brigade encampment of the Oregon and Idaho militia and regular army, which will begin Monday and continue for ten days. About 2200 men will participate. Two battalions of United States infantry were due to reach Gearhart late today, completing an overland hike from Vancouver Barracks, Washington.

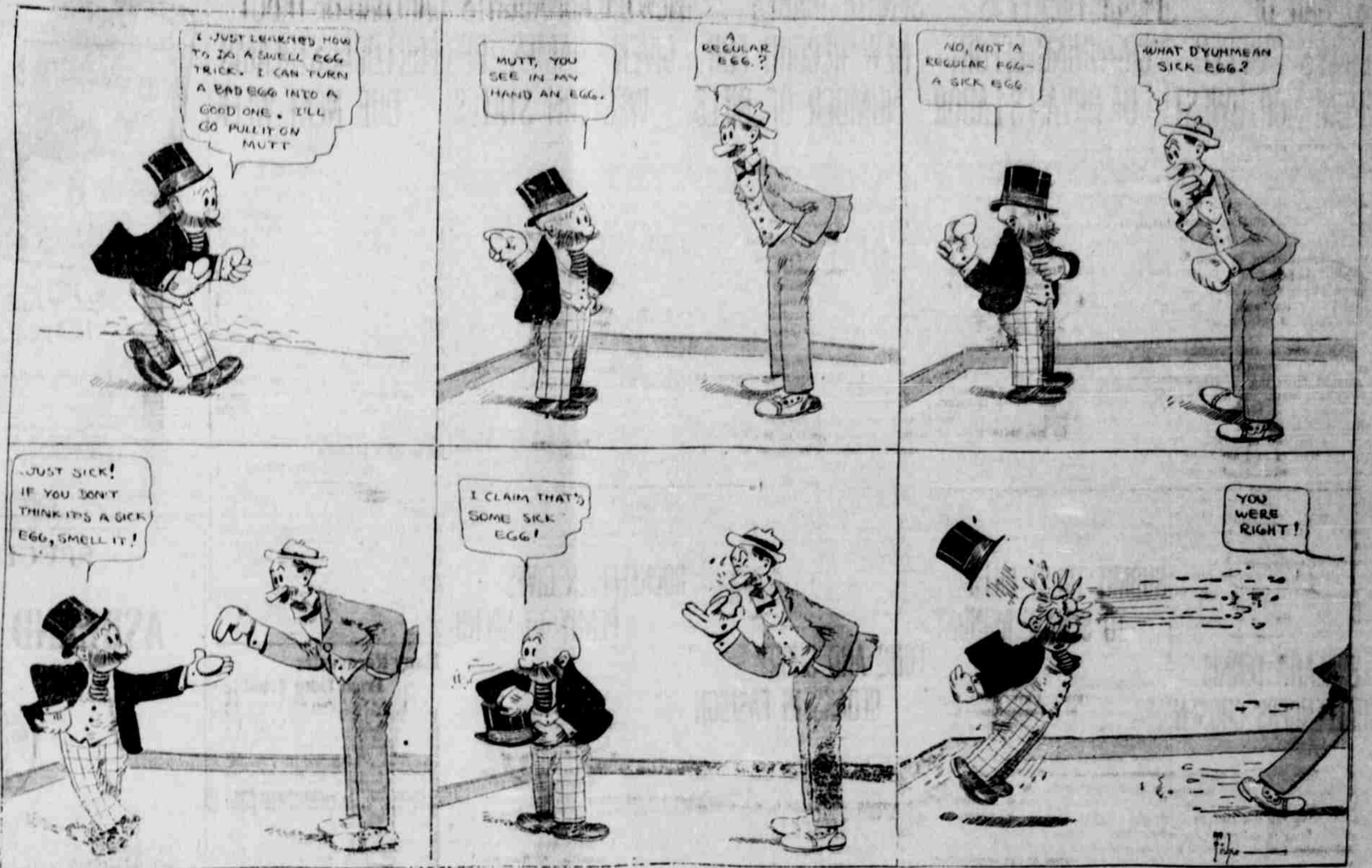
When the bridge is completed and before it is accepted by the county court, two ten ton road rollers running parallel or tandem will be run over the bridge to test it.
