NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Sealed proposals, addressed to the county clerk of Jackson county, Oregon, and endorsed "Proposals for a bridge over Evans Creek," for removing old structure, for furnishing plans and specifications, all tools, labor and materials necessary for the construction of the concrete foundations, approaches and furnishing and erecting a concrete or steel super-structure complete for a highway bridge over Evans creek near the town of Rogue River, Jackson county, Oregon, will be received by the county clerk of said county and state at its office in Jacksonville, Ore., until 10 o'clock a. m. Tuesday, July 21st, 1914, and at that time and place said court will publicly open and read all bids.

The bridge will have an 18 foot roadway and will be not less than 116 feet or more than 150 feet in length with necessary wooden approaches or dirt fills to make the job complete and ready for use.

When the bridge is completed and before it is accepted by the county court, two ten ton road rollers running parallel or tandem will be run over the bridge to test it.

Each bid is to be presented under sealed cover and shall be accompanied by cash, a bond made payable to Jackson county, or a certified check made payable to the treasurer of Jackson county, for an amount equal to at least 5 per cent of the amount bid, and no bid shall be considered unless such cash, bond or check is enclosed therewith; such bidder's bond shall be conditioned that if accompanied bid be accepted the party bidder will duly enter into and execute the contract.

Should the successful bidder to whom the contract is awarded fail to execute the same within ten days from the date of notification of such award, such cash, bond or check shall be forfeited to Jackson county and
