OUTLAWS WIN RIGHT TO RAID BASEBALL TEAMS

CHICAGO, July 16.—The Federal league scored today its first big legal victory in its war on organized baseball when the appellate court held the ten days' clause in the ball players' contract "null and void."

Federal officials here today were pleased with the decision and declared it would result in the addition of a score of star players to their organization.

RUSTIC LOG ARCH FOREST BOUNDARY

A rustic arch bearing a large name plate reading "Crater National Forest" is being erected over the Medford-Crater Lake road, just as it enters the national forest a few miles above Prospect, and not at the national park boundary as reported.

The arch will be made of six great logs 18 inches in diameter, and one 1 1/2 inches, with the bark left on. Two logs for uprights will be erected on each side of the road, and a log laid across these.

Four mules have been shipped from Portland for use on the Crater National forest. Two will be kept near Prospect and two near Trail for hauling this summer.

FORBID AMERICANS TO ADVISE MEXICANS

PROSPEROUS WITHOUT INCOME

EASTERN newspapers are having considerable fun with Kansas over its boasts of prohibition and prosperity, its hundred million dollar wheat crop and its automobiles, one for every eight families.

New York pays \$12,523,000, Illinois more than \$2,000,000, Massachusetts more than \$1,500,000; Pennsylvania more than \$3,000,000; Michigan, \$1,120,000; Ohio, \$914,000; Oregon, \$909,000; New Jersey, \$716,000; Connecticut and Rhode Island, \$733,000; Missouri, \$657,000; Texas, \$361,000; Minnesota, \$372,000; Virginia, \$102,000; Louisiana, \$159,000; Maryland, Delaware and the District of Columbia, \$832,000, and California, \$880,000, and Kansas but \$49,960.

In this connection it is interesting to figure out how much prosperous Kansas contributes to the support of the federal government, in return for the ten million dollars annually paid out in pensions in the Sunflower state.

Of the government revenues, \$75,000,000 comes from incomes, \$292,000,000 is from duties on foreign goods, mostly collected in New York City from the importers, \$346,000,000 is from internal revenue, taxes upon whisky, beer and tobacco.

Where would the nation get off financially if all the states were built on the Kansas plan?

Playing Ball in Ancient America

Pests in Forest Seeds

WASHINGTON, July 13.—Collectors of forest seeds, particularly on the Pacific coast, are recommended by the U. S. department of agriculture to make certain that the areas in which they work are not infested by insects which damage the cones and seeds of cone bearing trees.

The trees that were growing in sod or in permanent cover crops or even weeds and grass did not suffer as much as the best, clean-cultivated and irrigated orchards.
