NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Sealed proposals, addressed to the county court of Jackson county, Oregon, and endorsed "Proposals for a bridge over Evans Creek," for removing old structure, for furnishing plans and specifications, all tools, labor and materials necessary for the construction of the concrete foundations, approaches and furnishing and erecting a concrete or steel super-structure complete for a highway bridge over Evans creek near the town of Rogue River, Jackson county, Oregon, will be received by the county court of said county and state at its office in Jacksonville, Ore., until 10 o'clock a. m. Tuesday, July 21st, 1914, and at that time and place said court will publicly open and read all bids.

The bridge will have an 18 foot roadway and will be not less than 116 feet or more than 150 feet in length with necessary wooden approaches or dirt fills to make the job complete and ready for use.
