EIGHT-HOUR DAY BILL UPON BALLOT

OLYMPIA, Wash., July 24.—The final count of signatures on the initiative petitions for the "universal eight-hour day" bill was completed in the secretary of state early today and showed a total of 39,529 valid signatures, 7893 more than the number required to give the bill a place on the ballot at the November election. The bill, fathered by the socialists, would establish an eight-hour day in all lines of work in the state excepting agriculture, where employers would be permitted to work their men ten hours a day when necessary to care for crops.
