A night attack on the Belgian po sitions was awaited with great assurance by the Belgian troops, who had been strongly reinforced.

Further German troops were sup osed to be on the way to reinforce he regiments which suffered so secerely in yesterday's attack.

The Gazette publishes today what it says are the facts so far as known regarding the repulse of the German forces by the Belgians in the Liege district yesterday. The German losses are estimated at 8000 while the Belgians suffered far less; The alleged rout of the German seventh army corps is not confirmed in its entirety, however, says the Cazette, which adds :
